



## MISHKO NAMED TO ALL-TIME COACHES LIST

Hoop Historian Dennis Mishko was named as one of the Top 25 All-Time Coaches in the Scranton area by the Times-Tribune in a recent series of articles. The Pennsylvania paper ranked Mishko as number 18 on their all-time list. Mishko coached Keystone College to a 520-160 record over a 25-year career, and his team played in the Mens' National Junior College Championship game in 1986. Dennis was Junior College Coach of the Year in 1986 and 1989. In 1972, he also began his 20-year coaching career with the soccer program. During his tenure, his team's produced 17 All-American & Mid-Atlantic players. Currently, he coaches the Abington Heights boys soccer team, which has won five straight league championships.
